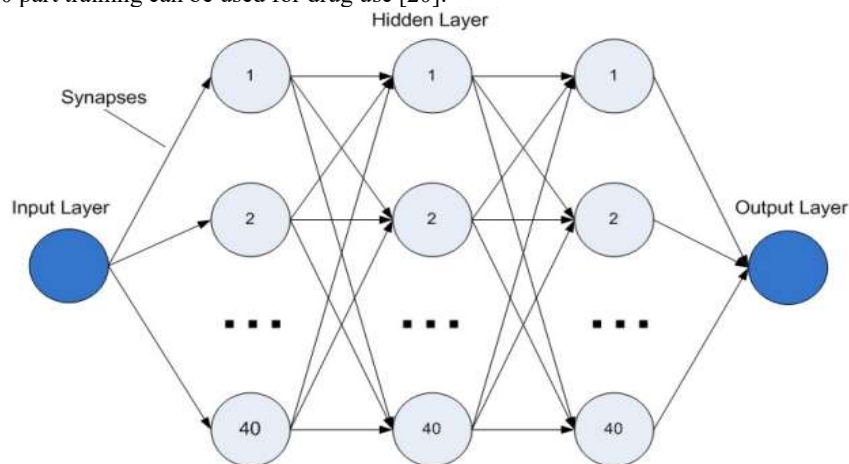


Figure 2: BCI neural Network Output Layers
